- Web platform: resources for teachers and directors, links to state child care systems, QRIS, and accreditation supports

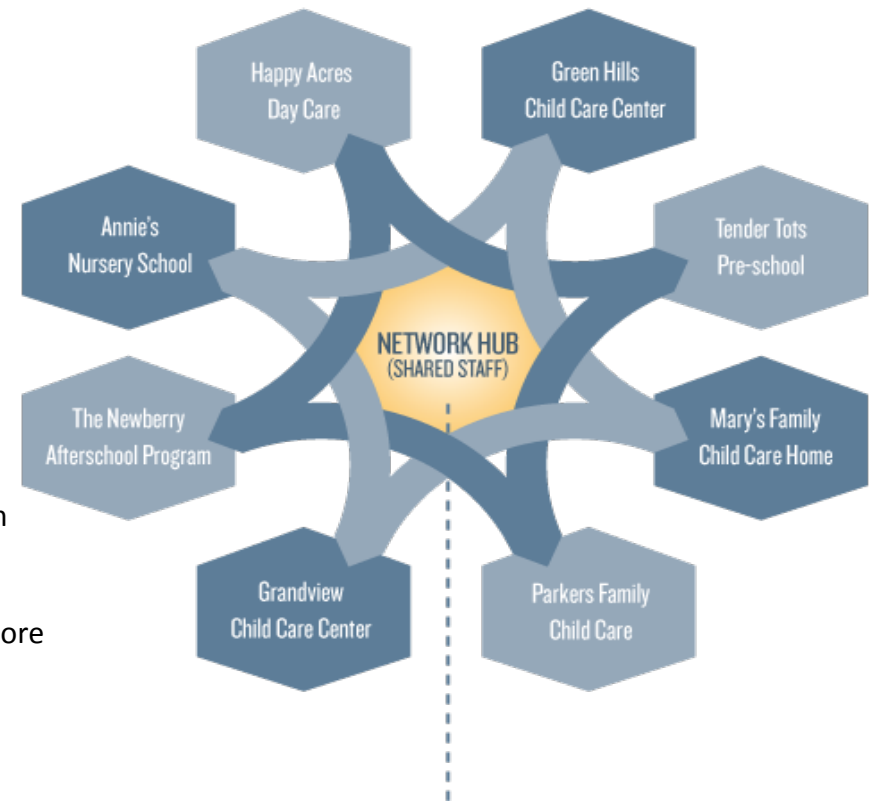
Cost reductions
